- 3. Have you been involved in any policy/advocacy efforts to inform your legislators of your concerns about the law or changes to the law?
- 4. Are there principles of Anabaptism that guide our response to these changes as healthcare providers, patients, and participants of a community of faith? For example, how might the following summary of the Anabaptist Vision inform this discussion?
 - Jesus is the center of our faith.
 - b. Community is the center of our lives.
 - c. Reconciliation is the center of our work.1
- 5. If MHF were to pursue development of a statement on Anabaptist Healthcare Ethics, what recommendations do you have for the scope and format of the work?
